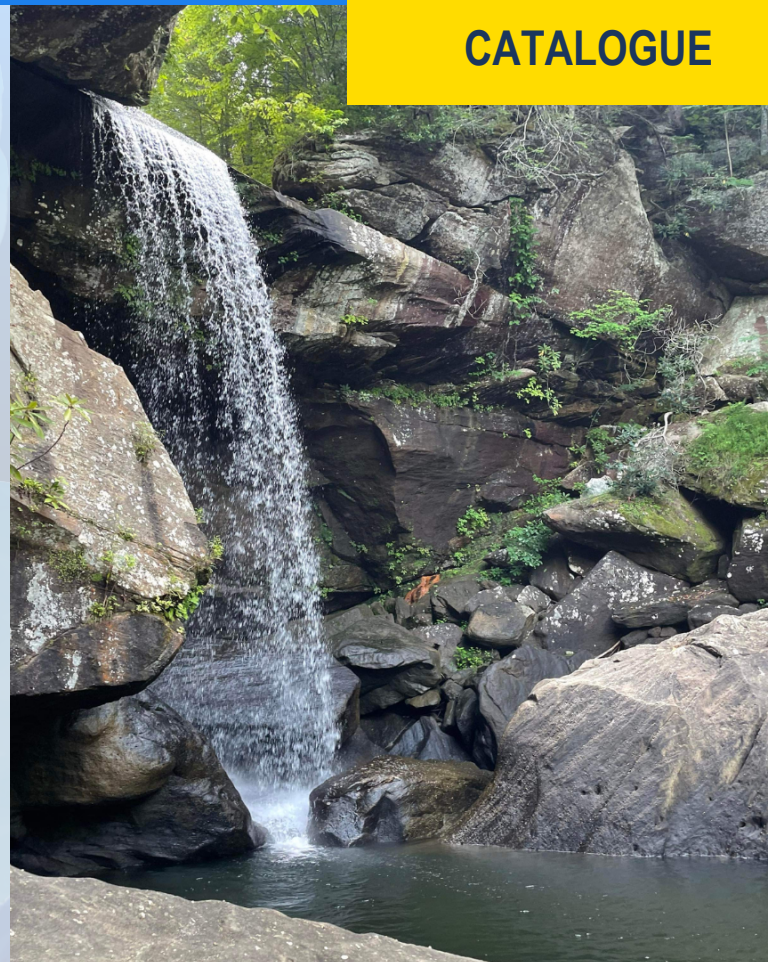

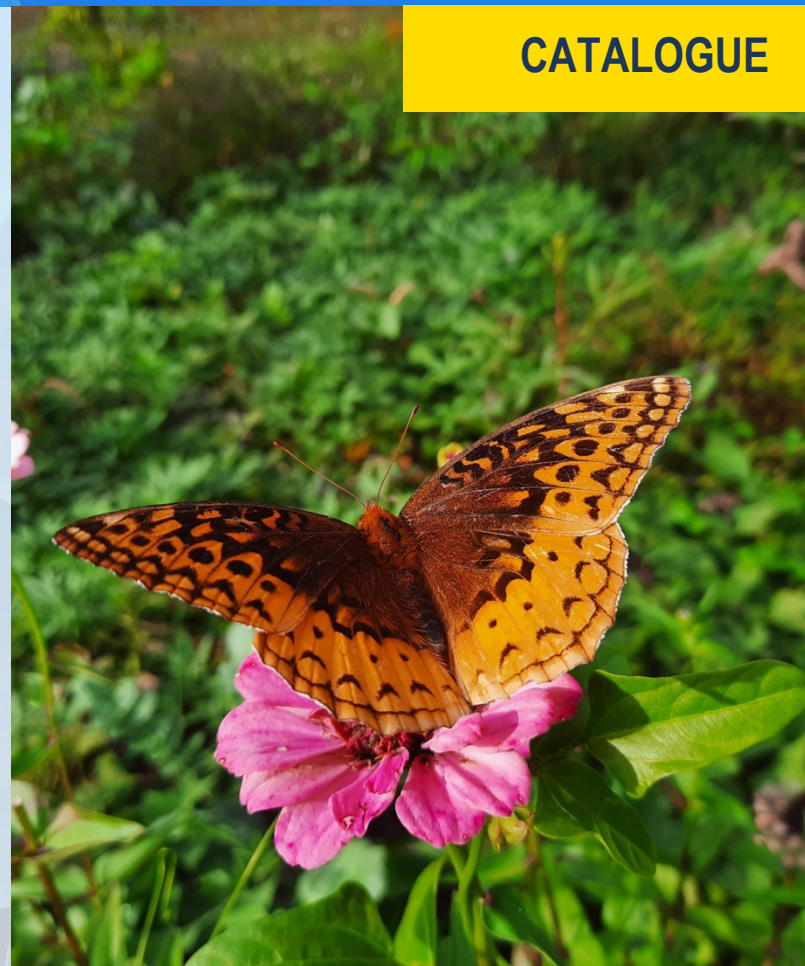

EXTENSION CERAMIC STUDIO

Open Studio

The community's interest in ceramics has grown significantly since the program's inception in 2017. This is evident by the high demand for wheel-throwing classes offered by the Extension Community Arts Agent. These 8-week courses provide foundational skills, but once the class ends, the students no longer have access to studio equipment to continue their practice.

To address this, the Community Arts Agent launched an open studio program. This program provides access to the fully equipped Extension Ceramics studio for those who have completed the wheel-throwing class or have prior experience. Operating three days a week for four months, it accommodates eight students, who, three months into the program, have utilized the studio 74 times and logged 140 hours of work time. The program has profoundly impacted participants, fostering artistic growth, community, and collaborative learning. Students have improved their skills, experimented with new techniques, and gained experience in studio management.
